



An Important Word About the Warehouse: Michael Harris



Last month's General Meeting at the Warehouse almost had the dubious honor of being not only the first meeting of 2108, but also our last at the Warehouse. Let me explain by taking us back in time to when we were at KJ's with our two faithful waiters, Jorge and Rodrigo.

We were spoiled, in so much as we always had Jorge and Rodrigo, they knew the members' names, they often knew

what we ordered most and could anticipate our orders. They in a sense became a part of the LA #1 HOG family. We also tipped them very well and we were, forgive the pun, in HOG heaven.

Now we have been at the Warehouse for awhile and I think because Jorge, Rodrigo and Marcel spoiled us, we don't really see ourselves from the outside. Basically we are a server's nightmare. Think about it – more then 80 people come in at totally different times, sit all over the restaurant, and if you don't know who's who, it is nearly impossible to get ordering done in an efficient manner. Remember, most restaurants won't even sit groups, which is what we are, unless the whole group is present. Why? 

Safety: LeRoy Frye



Motorcycles are fun and fuel efficient. That's not news to anyone who's ridden one. But neither is the fact that face it to ride, but more importantly they're also way more dangerous than a car. The cold reality is that motorcyclists are 30 times more likely to die in a crash than people in a car, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS). And nearly half of all motorcycle

deaths are the result of single-vehicle crashes.

The numbers are even scarier for older riders, who are increasingly taking up or returning to motorcycling after many years.

Because of slower reflexes, weaker eyesight, more brittle bones, and other disadvantages, riders more then 60 years old are three times more likely to be hospitalized after a crash than younger ones.

Still, many enthusiasts enjoy a lifetime of riding without injury. The key to optimizing your odds is to be prepared and avoid risks. Keep in mind that 48% of fatalities in 2010 involved speeding, according to the IIHS, and alcohol was a factor in 42%. Eliminate those factors and you've dramatically reduced your risk.

Don't buy more bike than you can handle. If you've been off of motorcycles for awhile, you may be surprised by the performance of today's bikes. Even models with small-displacement engines are notably faster and more powerful than they were 10 or 20 years ago.

When shopping for a bike, start with one that fits you. When seated, you should easily be able to rest both feet flat on the ground without having to be on tiptoes. Handlebars and controls should be within easy reach. Choose a model that's easy for you to get on and off the center stand; if it feels too heavy, it probably is.

Invest in antilock brakes. Now available on a wide array of models, antilock brake systems (ABS) are a proven lifesaver. IIHS data shows that motorcycles equipped with ABS brakes were 37% less likely to be involved in a fatal crash than bikes without it. "No matter what kind of rider you are, ABS can brake better than you," the IIHS study notes.

The reason is simple: locking up the brakes in a panic stop robs the rider of any steering control. That can easily lead to a skid and crash, which can result in serious injury. ABS helps you retain steering control during an emergency stop, and it can be especially valuable in slippery conditions.
